Beginning March 4th, we are encouraging all of our RCC Family to join us in a fast each Monday leading up to Easter. We hope you'll join us!

Why Fast?

Fasting is an opportunity to draw near to God and connect with Him in a special way. By taking an everyday experience (eating, using social media, watching TV, etc.) and instead turning to God in prayer, we grow our reliance on Him to replace something that we traditionally treat as necessary.

Why Fast Now?

As we prepare for Easter, we want to pray for more ongoing spiritual transformation. We want to see God's love more fully and more clearly. And, we want to come away from fasting more confident that God is able and happy to supply all the spiritual needs of His people.

How Will This Work?

Each Sunday during March, we'll share a theme, related Scripture, and questions to pray over. We'll send these through email and text message so that you have them before you start your fast on Monday.

To kick this off, we'll spend Sunday morning, March 3rd, talking about fasting as part of our time in Worship together.

SCRIPTURE THIS WEEK:

Ephesians 5:3-14

³ But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints. 4 Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving. 5 For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. 6 Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. ⁷ Therefore do not become partners with them; 8 for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light 9 (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), ¹⁰ and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. ¹¹ Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. ¹² For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. 13 But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, 14 for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says, "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

Life Group Discussion Questions

Ephesians 5:3-14

For the week of February 25, 2024

Reading the Text:

- 1. What was the big idea of the previous text, Ephesians 5:1-2?
- 2. Verses 3-7 gives some characteristics of what it looks like to walk in darkness. What about this list stands out to you most? Why? What does Paul say are the consequences for those who live in darkness?
- 3. What are the "empty words" Paul is referring to in v. 6, and how could they be deceitful?
- 4. Identify each time Paul mentions the idea of "light" in this text. What does "light" have to do with the life of those who are members of Christ's body?
- 5. How would you state the big idea of the Ephesians 5:3-14 in your own words?

Living It Out:

- 1. What does living in the darkness look like today? What are some of the deceiving lies culture uses to lure us into darkness? What does living in the light look like?
- 2. Describe a time where it was difficult for you to "discern what is pleasing to the Lord". What was it like?
- 3. How can our Life Group encourage each other to live more confidently as children of the light in a dark world? How can we appropriately practice and apply ideas from this text?
