### I Peter 2:18-25

What's it mean?

1. Re-Read I Peter 2:9 through 2:25. What does it look like to submit with respect? What about without respect?
2. When is the enduring of unjust suffering "commendable before God" according to Peter?
3. What does it mean to be 'conscious of God' while suffering?
4. According to verse 21, to what are Christians being called?
5. Read Isaiah 53:1-12. What references do you see from Isaiah 53 in I Peter 2:22-25?
6. What was the result of Christ's suffering on our behalf according to I Peter 2:24-25?
7. How might you title this section of Peter's letter?

How's it apply?

1. Who are some 'good and considerate masters' in your life? Who are some crooked or 'harsh' masters?
2. How do you typically respond to false accusations and/or unmerited blame?
3. How, practically, can we respond to suffering in a way that causes those around us (as in I Peter 2:12) to see Christ?
4. If, as Peter suggests in I Peter 2:19, an awareness of God's involvement is vital to 'suffering well' – How do we do that? How do we foster that awareness?

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
